The reality behind the SPHINX threatened Archeologists. The SPHINX Is an icon of ancient Egypt and one of the remembrances we immediately think of when Egypt is brought up. Located in the Giza pyramid complex, The Sphinx is one of the most aged buildings in the world. But there are so many things we yet don't know about it.

The Great SPINXS of Giza is about 66 feet in height and 240 feet in length, when the Sphinx was built it was the largest building of any kind on earth; it is one of the largest statues in the world. Unlike the great pyramids, the SPINX isn't made up of various building blocks but is rather carved from the bedrock. However, in more recent years, some limestone blocks have been added as part of the rehabilitation efforts of the Sphinx.

Many historians believe the Spinks was built sometime during the reign of khafre, or during the reign of his father, Khufu. While there is little doubt that Khufu commissioned the GREAT PYRAMIDS COMPLEX. No one has been able to put a date on when the Sphinx may have been built.

Age of the Sphinx

Many historians now say that khafre did not build the Spinks but simply unearthed it. Just to be clear there isn't any calendar or any historical document that give us detail about the Spinks construction. But some damage might give us a clue. As you all might know Giza is located in the center of a desert. Even back in 2500 BC, GIZA was still a desert, and it received very little rainfall, but Giza wasn't forever a desert. If you go back another 5000 years, Giza might have a climate more similar to a tropical rainforest. There are signs of erosion within the structure of Sphinx, Such a level of erosion would be impossible in the climate of Giza today. Accordingly some historians believe that the sphinx might be older than the oldest kingdom of Egypt.

Erosion on Sphinx

There is a conspiracy whether the erosion on sphinx is caused by sand or water, sand erosion usually makes the surface of stone sharp but in the case of the sphinx the stone is not sharp rather it has been decomposed and changes the texture thus the erosion in sphinx might have been caused due to water, but in the harsh desert climate of Giza it is not possible. But wait! Doesn't the Nile River flood now and then, if it was the cause then most of the erosion would have been in the bottom of the Sphinx but in reality, it is on top of the sphinx.

How the Sphinx Lost Its Nose

Just like the question surrounding its age this one also doesn't have scholarly consensus, originally the sphinx had a nose and a beard, part of the beard has been found but not a single part of its nose. Two theories that are known are one the napoleons during invasion tried to destroy the sphinx but could only manage to take off the nose, but considering the napoleons were careful with the sculptures of Egypt this theory might be false. But the second theory which could be true is that as the nose and the beard are external features thus the stone structure could not hold it and they fell away.
