London –

- 1) National Monument of Scotland (2.8 thousand) in New Town.
- 2) Scott Monument (7.4 thousand) Famous Gothic Sir Walter Scott.
- 3) Dugalt Stewart Monument in New Town. Edinburg – (ii)

(i) It is famous for its iconic skyline defined by soaring historic structures and memorials. The most prominent and marks are the dramatic Victorian scott monument in Princes Street gargens are the classical columns of the unfinished National Monument of Scotland a top caletunhill – There is also a believed smaller scale statue in the old town near greyfiuars Kerkyard, dedicated to the famous skye terrier who guarded his masters grave for 14 years. Other notable skyline features include the 19th Century Dugalt Steward Monument and the Political martyrs monument both easily found during a walk upto canton Hill list of Public Art in Edinburg.

Manchester – (iii) Step into the heart of Manchester, UK with this immersive walking tour through colly hurst, a district rich in history, nature, and urban transformation. We begin at the Mysterious peach stone Henge, a striking millennium sculpture by Andrew Mckewn nestled in Sandhills Park, once the site of the historic collyhurst quarry. The modern day Henge stone legacy the same stone that built chethams library, St. Anne's Church and the Original Manchester cathedral. From there explore sand street, passing stunning residential towers with panorama views of the Manchester skyline, including the vibrant green quarter. The journey continuous along Rechdate Road, through Eggington street, and onto collyhirst where urban life meets natural beauty. On one side, thriving residential

community on the other, the lush Irk Valley horn to the River Irk Valley home to River Ark one a vital artery of Manchester's industrial rise. This river powered mills and tanneries of the 1800s was described beautifully Manchester's monuments pay homage to the city's monuments role in the Industrial revolution and its deep cultural roots in music and sports. Alan Turing memorial located in the legendary computer scientist, mathematician and code breaker. The Cenotaph situated in St. Peters Square is the city's primary war memorial and a focal point of remembrance. The tank horse centre functioning as a museum stands as a vital monument. Victoria arches is a subterranean historic brick arches and has been stretching under the city centre.

Though there are other places in the world such as "the hanging garden of babylonia", The Egyptian mummies⁶, The leaning tower of Pisa but the Taj Mahal who of Mumtaz Mahal (one of the nine wonder of the world) and the Buland Darwaja in Fatehpur Sikri (Near Agra) stands at a height of 176 feet (54 meters) and is elevated on a 42 stop pedestal. It is the tallest gateway of the work commissioned by Mughal Emperor Akbar to commemorate his victory over Gujrat located to the south of Jama Masjid. It was started in 1573 CE and was completed in 1575 CE (2 years). The magnify architectural marvel stands elevated on a platform 42 feet (12.50 meters) above the road several Persian inscriptions in Naskh script are inscribed on the archways, iwans and walls of the Buland Darwaza. The purpose of Buland Darwaza Akbar's intention to honour the Sufi Salim. Buland Darwaza means (High Gate).

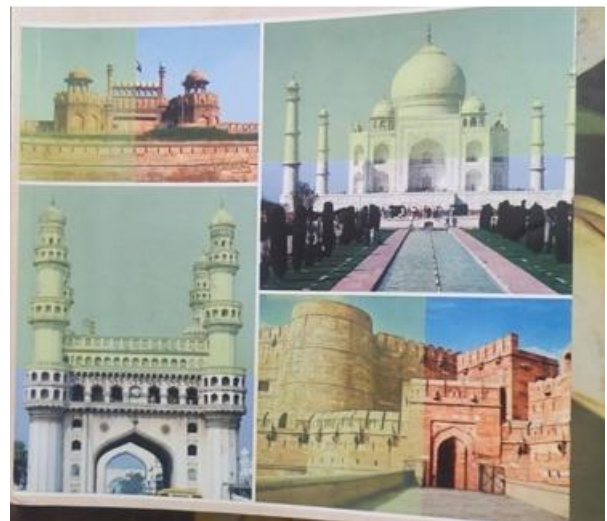
2. Summary
